

POLISH DELEGATION VISITS BALTIMORE

Members of the Polish Nobility Association may wish to know of the following recent activities of members. On October 6, 1993 the president of the Association,

H.S.H. Prince Rogier Chylinski-Polubinski, was cohost with the Governor of Maryland, the Honorable William Donald Shaefer, at a reception of international significance. The guests of honor were a delegation from the Lodz Region, Poland, The delegation was headed by His Excellency Governor Waldemar Bohdanowicz. Other members of the delegation were: The Honorable Mr. Dariusz Rospendek, Director of Economic Development Lodz Regional Government: Mr. Marek Michalak, Director of Privatization, Lodz Regional Government; Prof. Michal Sewerynski, Rector. University of Lodz. The reception was held at Government House in Baltimore, Maryland. This very large and magnificent nineteenth century brownstone residence is maintained as an accommodation for official guests of the City of Baltimore. Government House is staffed and operated as one of the many activities of the **Baltimore International**

Culinary College. Prince Rogier is the President of this College which has not only its large multi-structured main campus in Baltimore but also a 100-acre campus in Ireland.

OBITUARY

We note the passing of Count Edward Raczynski, age 101, the aristocratic Polish diplomat, who was ambassador to Great Britain at the outbreak of WWII and a member of the wartime Polish government-in-exile. He died at his home in London. He signed the treaty in which Britain guaranteed assistance to Poland against Nazi Germany. During the war, Count Raczynski simultaneously held the post of acting foreign affairs minister in the London based Polish government, and then minister of state in charge of foreign affairs. He was president of the anti-communist government-inexile from 1979-1986, retiring at age 95. Count Raczynski was born to a landowning family which set up a lavish library in Poznan. He is survived by Aniela Mieczyslawska, his third wife whom he married in 1991, and three daughters from his second marriage.

For us to face Poland's future as loval supporters of our ancestral homeland, we must find a niche where we can be useful

I challenge the PNA to define a mission for our organization. a mission which will make us proud to have descended from the blue bloods that previously managed our one great nation, a mission which will make those people now living in Poland respect and seek us -- a mission which will help Poland to again become an important keystone in our modern world.

THE POLISH ORDER OF THE VIRTUTI MILITARI AND ITS CAVALIERS

An International Bicentennial Observance

The 200th anniversary of the establishment of the Polish Order of the Virtuti Militari by King Stanislaw August Poniatowski took place in 1992. To commemorate this occasion, Prof. Dr. Zdzislaw P. Wesolowski, the author of Polish Orders, Medals, Badges and Insignia, the only book of its kind in the world which contains all Polish civilian and military decorations, has announced the completion of a book about the Polish Order of the Virtuti Militari and its Cavaliers. It will be the first book in polish History which will list all the recipients of the Order from 1792. Their sacrifice and contribution to democracy in Poland and the world must never be forgotten.

The book will be in the English and Polish language and entitled The Golden Book of the Cavaliers of the Polish Order of the Virtuti Militari (Zlota Ksiega Kawalerow Polskiego Orderu Virtuti Militari). It will make a significant contribution to Polish military history for the futrure generations. The book contains the history of the Order, photographs of the various styles and types of crosses and a listing of every person and unit, both Polish and foreign. which was awarded the Order by name, rank, cross serial number, unit of assignment at the time of the award and date. The listing is sequential both, alphabetical and by cross number. It will contain the names of over 26,000 persons and military organizations. The completed research for the book was made possible because of the cooperation the author received from the office of the National Decorations Bureau in Warsaw and the Military Records Center in Rembertow, Poland; the President of the Polish Government in Exile and the Sikorski Institute and Museum, both in London.

The book will have over 800 pages. The cost is \$100 for the deluxe subscribers/publishers/collectors special limited edition. Anyone ordering the book in this category will have their name listed if they wish as sponsors of the book and receive a miniature commemorative Virtuti Militari cross. The regular issue will cost \$50.

GENEALOGY INFORMATION & PUBLICATIONS

We have received correspondence from the Institut fur Historische Familienforshung in Vienna of their competence and availability to do certain ancestry research. Their address is:

A letter from the General Manager, Dr. Felix Gundacker, notes they are particularly professional ancestry researchers in Austria, Poland, Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Jugoslavia and Germany.

Notable is their service in the Period before 1921.

Along these same lines, we wish to inform the members that the Library of Congress has released a new publication, Genealogies Cataloged by the Library of Congress since 1986. A limited number of copies are available. The PNA recently came into possession of a noteworthy publication which whould prove a most invaluable research tool for the beginner genealogists. The book is titled Korzenie Polske (Polish Roots) by Rosemary A Chorzempa, published by the Genealogical Pub. Co., 1001 N. Calvert Street, Baltimore Maryland, 21202 Notes 17.95.

(The Association does not normally provide endorsements, we nevely report these items and let the membership judge for itself for any future action.)

Library of Congress Releases New Genealogies Publication With this new publication, the Library continues the long tradition of publishing its bibliographic records for family histories in its collections. This new publication picks up where the discontinued series edited by Marian Kaminkow left off in 1985.

There are several new features which provide additional assistance to researchers and librarian. In Section 1, there are more than 700 pages of detailed listings by family surfame, alphabetically arranged. The 11,769 entries gibe complete and accurate access to the genealogies cataloged between 1986 and 1991.

The nearly 400 pages of Section II contain 16, 170 established family names and 22,614 cross references from variant forms of these names. This unique list has never been available before. It lists the authorized family sumanes as used for access in catalogs in libraries throughout the United States and abroad.

The third section is a handy list of 3,564 family listories converted to microform and available for the first time. Since the original volumes are now brittle, they are available in very few libraries today. Genealogies Cataloged by the Library of Congress Since 1986 is available. April 8, 18992. The price is 470. (North America) and \$75 (International).
